## Instructions

This application should be completed by students trying to qualify for in-state (resident) tuition under one of the following exceptions:

- U.S. military service member assigned to active duty within Utah. (Includes Utah National Guard and Active Reserves.)
  - Immediate family member of a U.S. military service member currently assigned to active duty within the state of Utah.
  - U.S. military veteran.
  - Immediate family member of a U.S. military veteran who has separated within the last five years.
  - Eligible person entitled to benefits under 38 U.S.C. Chapter 30, Montgomery G.I. Bill – Active Duty Educational Assistance Program, or Chapter 33, Post 9/11 Educational Assistance Program.
  - Utah resident away on active military duty taking only online classes at the University of Utah (including cases where the student is a spouse or dependent child).
  - An individual who maintains residency in Utah with an intent to return but who is serving on active duty in the US Armed Forces and is assigned outside of Utah (includes cases where the student is a spouse or dependent child).
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If you are the dependent child of Utah resident(s) away on active military duty, a Utah resident away on active military duty taking only online classes at the University of Utah, or a Utah resident away on active military duty and returning to Utah on terminal leave, you should complete the Residency Reclassification Application, available online at [admissions.utah.edu/apply/residency](http://admissions.utah.edu/apply/residency).

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### You must take the following steps to apply for in-state (resident) tuition:

- You must be admitted or permitted to enroll in classes at the University of Utah.
- You must read these instruction pages and the University of Utah Institutional Policy and Board of Regents Policy R512 found on our website at [admissions.utah.edu/apply/residency](http://admissions.utah.edu/apply/residency).
- Download, complete, print, and sign this application form. **Handwritten signatures are required.**
- Submit your application, along with all required documents, by or before the appropriate term deadline. If you fax or mail your materials to us, you should follow up to confirm we received them.
- If you are unable to submit required documentation, you must provide a written statement, including your full name, Student ID#, and an explanation of why you are unable to provide the documentation. You should know that providing the written statement does not waive the required documentation. Failure to provide required documentation can and often does result in denying your request for reclassification.
- Check your UMail account regularly to be sure you receive any notifications for additional documentation in a timely manner.
- Submit additional supporting documentation by the deadline posted in our request notification.
- If you are applying for scholarships for resident students, write “Priority Process for Scholarship Consideration” at the top of your application. We will try to accommodate these requests, but cannot waive requirements to prove eligibility for residency reclassification.
- Late applications submitted during the first week of term-length classes must include a Letter of Appeal explaining the reasons you were not able to apply by the term deadline.
- Late applications submitted after the Friday of the first week of term-length classes will be considered for the next available academic term.

## Required Documentation

Applicants seeking residency for tuition purposes must submit documentation verifying their eligibility. These instructions describe documentation required for each residency exception listed below.

### **U.S. military service member assigned to active duty within Utah (including Utah National Guard and Active Reserves):**

- Copy of the military orders placing you in Utah on active duty assignment.
- Copy of your current military ID card.

### **Immediate family member of a U.S. military service member currently assigned to active duty within the state of Utah:**

- Copy of the military orders placing the service member in Utah on active duty assignment.
- Copy of the military service member's military ID card or a copy of your military privilege card.

### **U.S. military veteran:**

- Copy of Military DD-214, which includes proof of honorable or general discharge.
- Signed written declaration that you have relinquished residency in any other state and do not maintain a residence elsewhere—found in the signature section of this application.
- Objective evidence that you have demonstrated an intent to establish residency in Utah, which may include any one of the following:
  - Utah voter registration card
  - Utah driver's license or identification card
  - Utah vehicle registration
  - Evidence of employment in Utah
  - Rental agreement showing your name and a Utah address
  - Utility bills showing your name and Utah address

### **Immediate family member of a U.S. military veteran who has separated within the last five years:**

- Copy of military veteran's DD-214, which includes proof of honorable or general discharge within the last five years.
- Signed written declaration that you have relinquished residency in any other state and do not maintain a residence elsewhere—found in the signature section of this application.
- If applicant is the dependent child of the U.S. military veteran, a copy of the military service member's most recent federal tax return verifying they claimed the applicant as a tax dependent.
- Objective evidence that you have demonstrated an intent to establish residency in Utah, which may include any one of the following:
  - Utah voter registration card
  - Utah driver's license or identification card
  - Utah vehicle registration
  - Evidence of employment in Utah
  - Rental agreement showing your name and a Utah address
  - Utility bills showing your name and Utah address

Please do not submit tax documents through email. It will not be accepted. Due to guidance from the Dept. of Education we can no longer accept tax documents via email.

### **Eligible person entitled to benefits under 38 U.S.C. Chapter 30, Montgomery G.I. Bill – Active Duty Educational Assistance Program, or Chapter 33, Post 9/11 Educational Assistance Program:**

- Evidence of eligibility under Title 38 U.S. Code Chapter 30, Montgomery G.I. Gill – Active Duty Educational Assistance Program, or Chapter 33, Post 9/11 Educational Assistance Program. Students may obtain verification from the VA or online through their eBenefits account. If students have questions on how to go about this, the University of Utah Office of the Registrar Veteran Services can assist with this process.
- Signed written declaration that you will utilize G.I. Bill benefits – found in the signature section of this application.
- Objective evidence that you have demonstrated an intent to establish residency in Utah, which may include any one of the following:
  - Utah voter registration card
  - Utah driver's license or identification card
  - Utah vehicle registration
  - Evidence of employment in Utah
  - Rental agreement showing your name and a Utah address
  - Utility bills showing your name and Utah address

The applicant is required to establish his/her own domiciliary ties once he/she makes the move to Utah in order to meet other Utah laws that govern driving in the state or operating a vehicle in the state of Utah, etc.

**Utah resident away on active military duty taking only online classes at the University of Utah (including cases where the student is a spouse or dependent child):**

- A copy of the military service member's military identification card (if the applicant is a spouse or dependent child, a copy of the applicant's military privilege card can be submitted instead).
- A copy of the military service member's most recent military orders
- Objective evidence that the military service member has not relinquished residency ties to Utah, which may include any one of the following:
  - Utah voter registration card
  - Utah driver's license or identification card
  - Utah vehicle registration
  - Copy of a Utah income tax return, in the military service member's or a military service member's spouse's name, filed as a Utah resident
  - Proof that the military service member or military service member's spouse owns a home in Utah, including a property taxnotice for property owned in Utah.
- If applicant is a dependent child, a copy of the military service member's most recent federal tax return verifying they claimed the applicant.

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**An individual who maintains residency in Utah with an intent to return but who is serving on active duty in the US Armed Forces and is assigned outside of Utah (includes cases where the student is a spouse or dependent child):**

- A copy of the military service member's military identification card (if applicant is a dependent child or spouse, a copy of the applicant's military privilege card can be submitted instead).
- A copy of the military service member's most recent military orders.
- Objective evidence that the military service member has not relinquished residency ties to Utah, which may include any one of the following:
  - Utah voter registration card
  - Utah driver's license or identification card
  - Utah vehicle registration
  - Copy of a Utah income tax return, in the military service member's or a military service member's spouse's name, filed as a Utah resident

- If applicant is a dependent child, a copy of the military service member's most recent federal tax return verifying they claimed the applicant.
