General Information

Any student other than a non-immigrant, who meets all the following requirements, shall be exempt from paying the non-resident portion of the total tuition at University of Utah. Student information provided in this affidavit is strictly confidential unless disclosure is required by law.

Requirements

- The student must have attended a Utah high school for three or more years.
- The student must have graduated from a Utah high school or attained the equivalent of a high school diploma (GED) in Utah.
- The student cannot have registered at a Utah System of Higher Education institution earlier than Fall of 2002.
- Students must submit their official high school transcript(s) validating three-year high school attendance in Utah and graduation from a Utah high school.
- A student, who is without lawful immigration status, must file an affidavit with the University of Utah stating that he or she has filed an application to legalize immigration status, or will file an application as soon as he or she is eligible to do so.
- Students who hold a non-immigrant visa are not eligible for this waiver.
- The student must file a signed affidavit with the University of Utah that indicates they have met all applicable conditions described above.
- Students eligible for this waiver who are transferring to another Utah public college or university must submit a new request (and documentation if required) to each college under consideration.
- Students meeting the criteria will have the non-resident portion of their tuition waived, but continue to be classified as non-residents.
- Students who qualify for the non-resident tuition waiver are not eligible for state and federal financial aid.

Procedures for Requesting a Utah Exemption from Non-Resident Tuition at the University of Utah

1. If you are a new or returning student, submit the Non-Resident Tuition Waiver and Affidavit at the end of this document. Send the affidavit to the University of Utah Office of Admissions.
2. In addition to any credentials necessary for admissions to the University of Utah, arrange to have the Utah high school transcript showing completion of at least three years in a Utah high school and proof that you have graduated from the Utah high school or have an equivalency of a high school diploma in Utah.
