SESSION DESCRIPTIONS

ADMISSIONS 101: ACING YOUR APPLICATION Still have questions about the admissions process? Come join us for a follow-up session on the admissions application process. Admissions Counselors will be available to answer any lingering questions, review important dates and deadlines, and give you helpful tips on filling out your admissions application.

BLOCK U is a program that allows you to navigate all of your general education requirements in a learning community, get to know six to eight faculty from three to four departments, and engage in a meaningful project all within your first year.

BUSINESS SCHOLARS The Business Scholars program offers a small, high-achieving, cohort of students a comprehensive immersion into global business disciplines. The program provides hands-on business experience from day one on campus. Students receive one-on-one academic counseling and a personal career management advisor to help understand the opportunities available. Students travel regionally and internationally to examine companies and network with business leaders, faculty, and peers for an educational experience unlike any other.

CAMPUS RECREATION SERVICES provides a welcoming and dynamic environment to meet fitness and wellness goals of students and other members of the University community. The George S. Eccles Student Life Center provides a wide range of activities, services, and amenities. A 54' climbing wall, 50-meter lap pool, a 15,000 square foot fitness center, and a nationally recognized Outdoor Adventure trip and rental program are just the beginning of the many options for your fitness and recreation goals. A Massage Therapy studio, Freshen's Café, a branch of the University Federal Credit Union, and plenty of study nooks ensure the Eccles Student Life Center is more than just a gym.
